Just prior to my departure for Northern Italy I was briefed on the political and economical crisis I would encounter. People jokingly advised me to limit my starches and avoid wearing red since the Communist party was gaining a visible amount of control.

My host family, whom I lived with in July, definitely served huge amounts of Pasta, however they were highly conservative in their political beliefs. Our apartment was located on the outskirts of Trento, a quaint city surrounded by the pre-Alps. At the end of July my nineteen year old host-brother and I set out for Terzolas, a tiny village situated in the midst of the Italian Alps.

Forty of us, 8 Americans, 15 Italians, 15 Austrians, a German, and one Swede inhabited an abandoned hotel we ironically baptised, "Isle di France". We had no hot water, possessed one functional bathroom, and lacking an adequate number of rooms we dragged twenty beds into the attic creating the "community bedroom." Here I was exposed to less starch and an ample amount of Communism and Radicalism. I was impressed to discover the Italian Campers', ranging in age from 15-23, acute awareness of their political situation. They were all involved in either the Communist or Revolutionary parties eager to discuss their liberal ideologies. We functioned as a small community, avoiding specific leaders and striving to involve ourselves with the townspeople. We gathered hay, cleared roads, stacked wine crates and invited village experts to lecture on tourism, agriculture and religion. The natives accepted us and the mayor, monks, and town youth invited us to their homes for social gatherings.

My entire experience has been extremely enlightening! I am immensely grateful to the American Field Service Organization and encourage active student involvement. I only regret the fact that a similar inter-culture adventure was not possible for every fellow American!

If you think standing there, in the Amazon Jungle holding a boa constrictor (with the help of an Indian) is a different experience, well you're right! But this experience was one of many new, exotic adventures I had in the heart of the rugged, wild Amazon Jungle . . . at least, in a capital city, Manaus, in the heart of the Amazon . . . well actually, in a wealthy suburb of a city in the heart of the rugged Amazon Region of Brazil . . . have I made my point?

From late June until early September, 1976, my life transformed to the Brazilian way via AFS. Having come from a liberal, middle-class American family, I entered a conservative, upper-class Brazilian one; complete with servants and a chauffeur! From American junk, processed food to fresh and delicious Brazilian cuisine. From New England weather to the tropics of 3° latitude. The list goes on and on, but, perhaps the most interesting change was going from an American society that leans toward sexual equality, to an utterly male-oriented society which was especially apparent in the north of Brazil, where Manaus is located. I will admit, though, that I had a ball trying to liberate my Brazilian peers! I did everything from conversing (in Portuguese) on sexual equality to being the only female, that I knew of, who dared to infiltrate the all-male soccer field! Did I say that I had fun? But all good things come to an end, and, so, I returned to North Haven and to the high school from which I came. It has been an "interesting" senior year for me, and for all of us. I shall always look back on my AFS summer with a wide grin and I can say to all of you who don't know already, there is a great, beautiful world outside of North Haven, Connecticut. Please, go forth, discover, and enjoy!

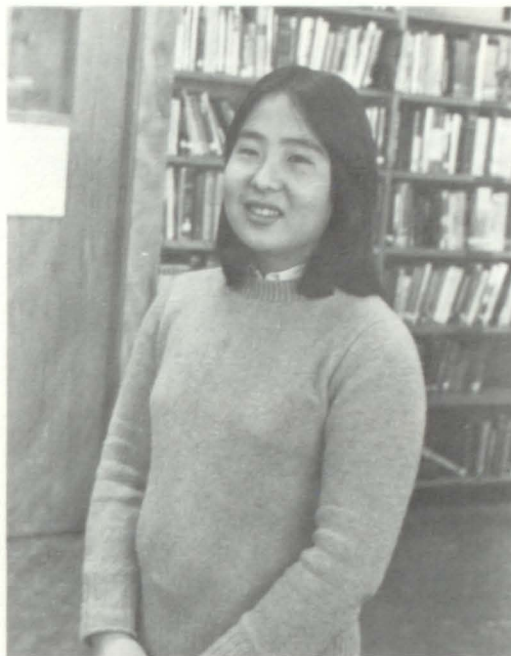

My life here has been different from my life in Brazil. I think everybody should try to go abroad, enriching his life through understanding of different cultures. And AFS is a good way to reach this!

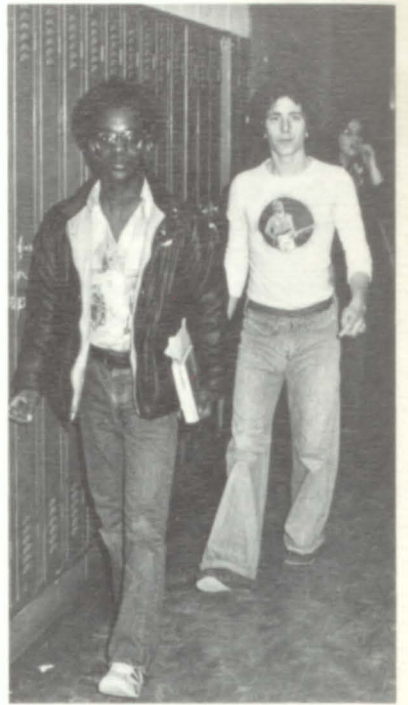

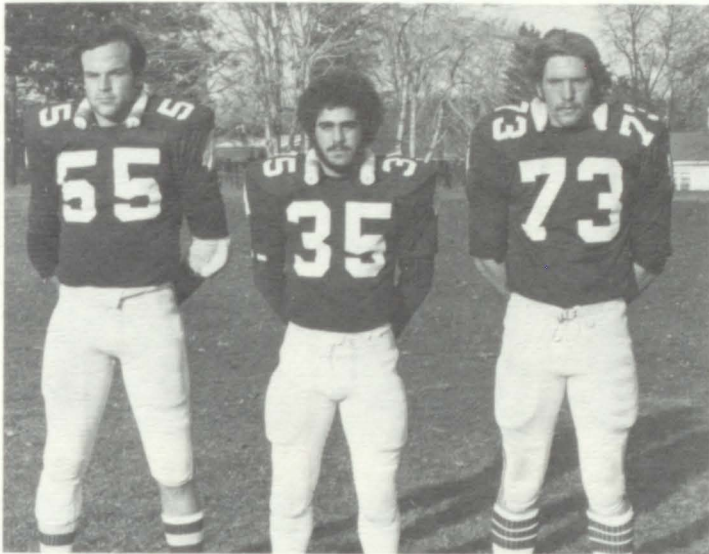


## Football '76

Seniors Stacie Rice, Larry Manguilli, Brian Brangi, and Gary DeMayo finished their careers on a high note, as they were selected to represent North Haven High School on the 1976 All-Housatonic League team. DeMayo set a school rushing record for most yards in a season with 1293. Manguilli and Rice along with fellow tri-captain, Chris Griffin, were outstanding performers throughout the season. In addition to these players, Walt Nester received the team's Most Valuable Player award, while Nick Vallone garnered the Mike Vanacore Sportsmanship Award.

The squad was represented by a total of 21 seniors, each of whom distinguished themselves at some point during the 1976 season.
