


THE ROAD NOT TAKEN


Two roads diverged in a yellow wood,

To where it bent in the undergrowth;


Then took the other, as just as fair,

And that has made all the difference,


















WINCHESTER PROJECT

During the latter half of the 1966 school year, a novel and exciting extracurricular activity was taking shape. Initiated and organized by history department chairman Raymond Brown in collaboration with Mr. Robert Pleasure, Assistant Principal of Winchester School in New Haven, the Winchester Project has this year been realized.

Each Friday afternoon participating North Haven students act as tutors for forty fourth, fifth, and sixth graders from Winchester Elementary School. The children are brought to the high school by bus to be tutored for an hour and a half in mathematics, reading, spelling, or social studies. A one-to-one ratio between high school and elementary students allows for as much personal attention as possible.

It is hoped that the project gives the Winchester students extra help not otherwise readily available in order that their progress in school may proceed as rapidly as possible.

This year the program has been run as much as possible by student chairmen Marilyn Brewster, Karl Gustafson, and Kim Lacy.

MODEL CONGRESS

The first model congress in Connecticut was held at North Haven High School April 21-22, 1967. A common interest in the affairs of this nation brought over two hundred delegates to NHHS from participating schools within the state. Here the delegates experienced first-hand the workings of the legislative branch of government in Washington, D.C. Debating the issues that face the nation on the domestic and foreign scenes, the students were called upon to voice their opinions and propose their own solutions.

Delegates were assigned to committees according to their particular fields of interest. After deciding within their committees which bills were most likely to pass approval, the senators and congressmen retired to their floor meetings to discuss the pending legislation. Each

bill's author rose to explain to his fellow delegates the need for his proposed law. Logrolling and other political devices were used to gain support for the various bills. In order not to inhibit debate, an adopted form of Robert's Rules was followed.

Senator Abraham Ribicoff addressed a joint meeting of the assembly on Saturday morning, devoting a majority of his speech to the mechanics of government and the job of the elective official.

The Model Congress was an example of youth educating itself through experience. If a heightened awareness of the intricacy of governing a people is an achievement worthy of months of preparation, then NHHS's Model Congress was a project both worthwhile and successful.
