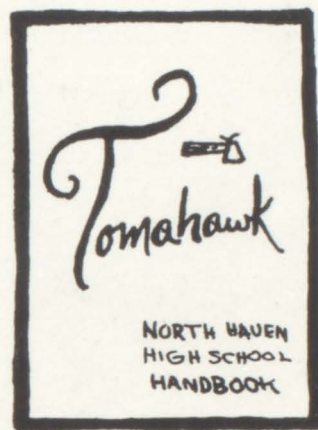

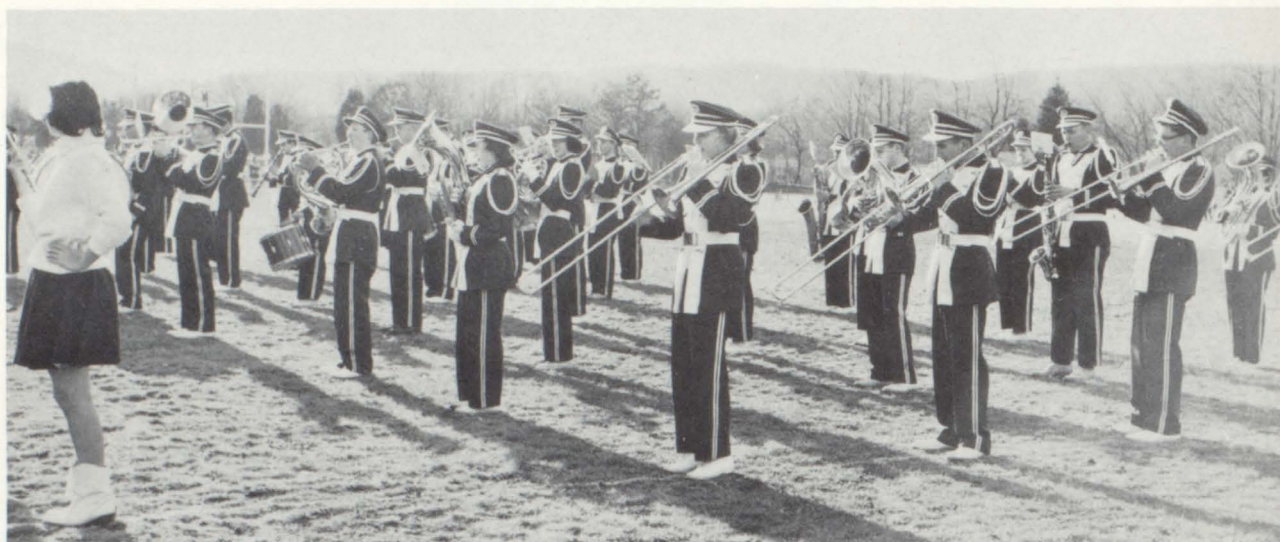

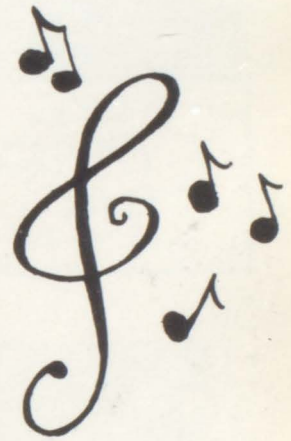

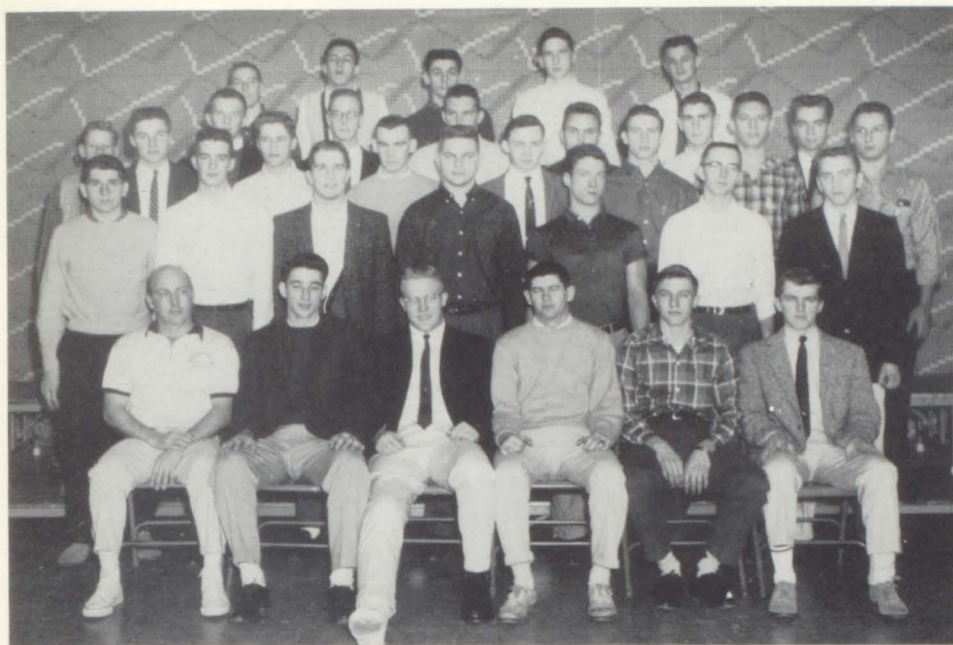

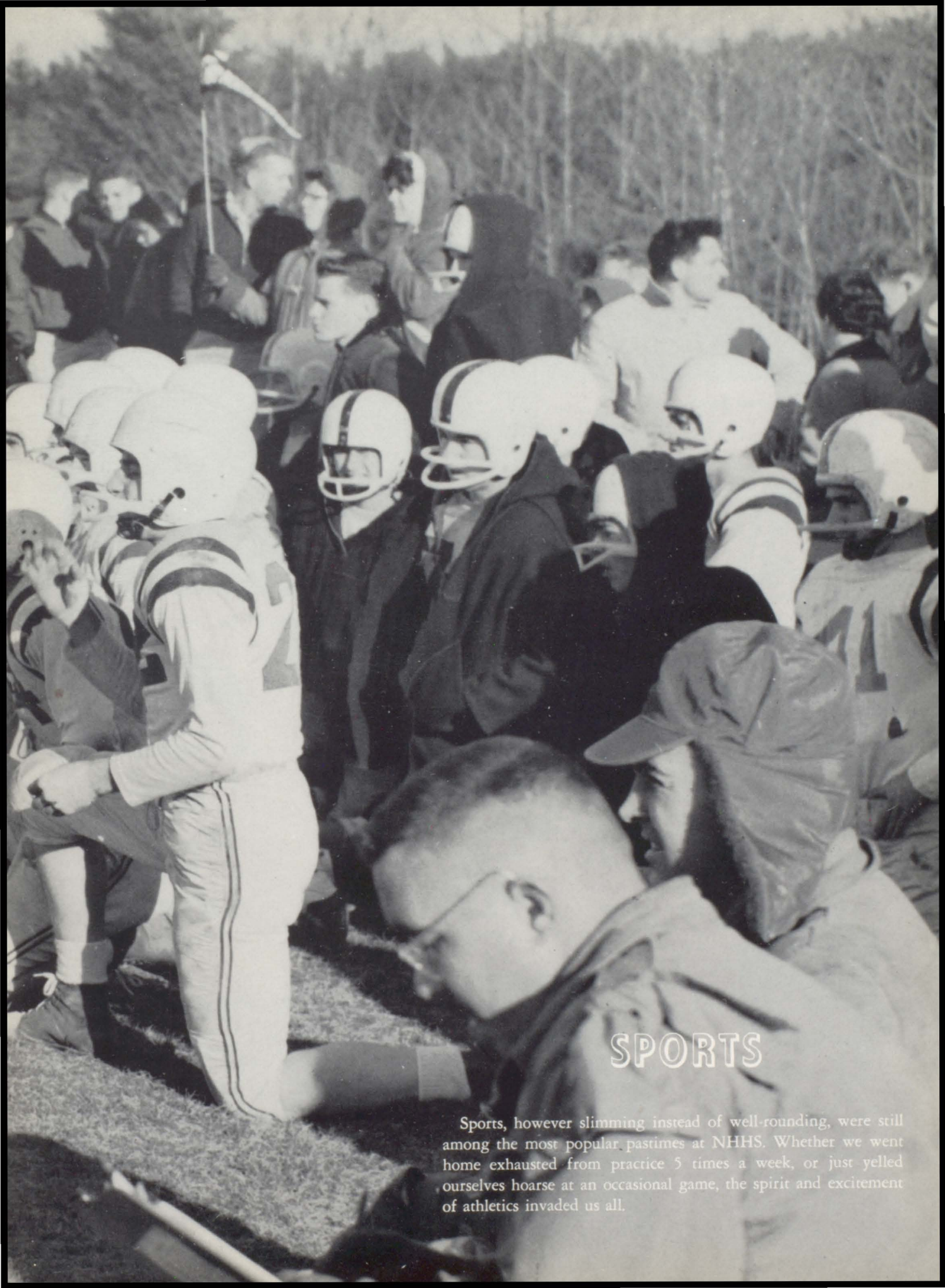


PEP CLUB

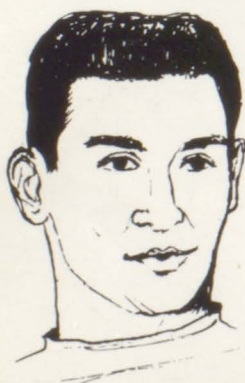

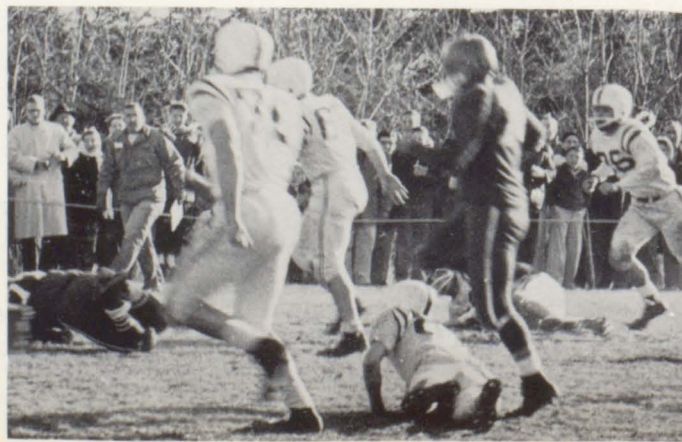

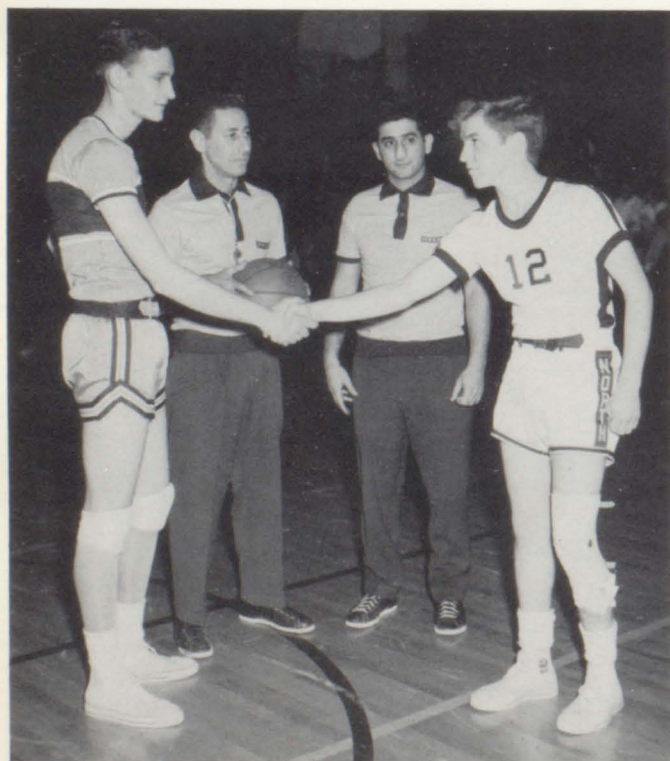

The JV's co-captained by Marylou Parrella and Barbara Ibsen, had a lot of potential talent that will aid the Varsity in future years.



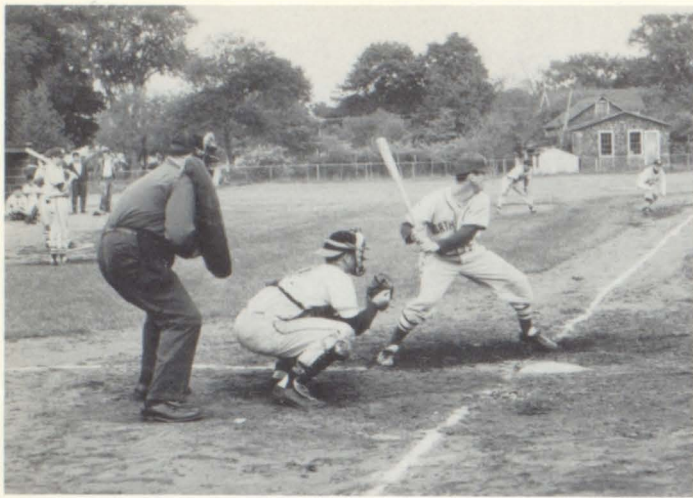

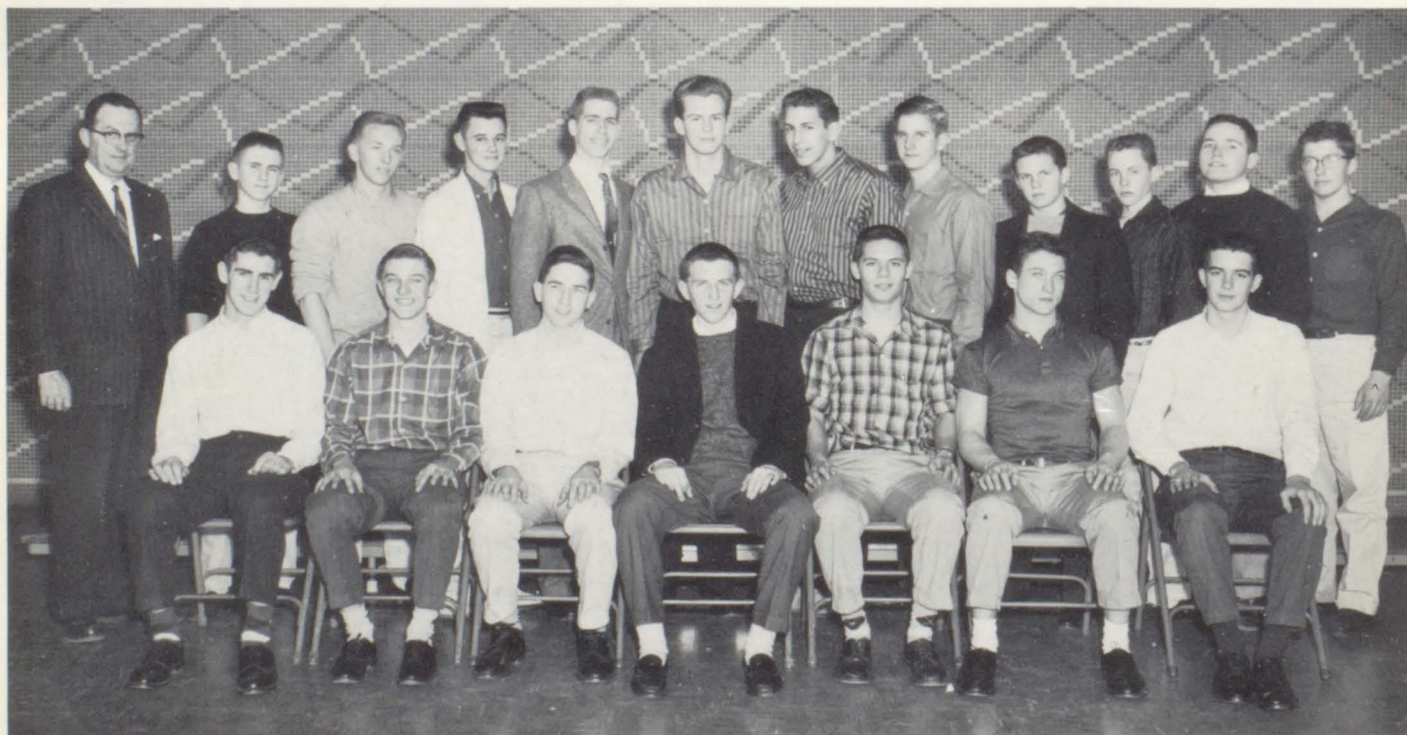
VARSITY SWIMMING TEAM
